



## *Update June 2010*

- 10 beds, mattresses, blankets and sheets and mosquito nets for the wards for adults at E & E medical centre could be bought thanks to a donation from t Goeie Doelen Winkeltje.
- Ibrahim Kalinaki has left E & E medical centre, which made the job of doctor became vacant. Hope Alive Uganda put up a job vacancy on their website. Also, Hope Alive Uganda contacted the hospitals in Jinja and Kamuli to spread the word there is a vacancy at the medical centre in Kisozi. Not long after, Hope Alive Uganda was able to appoint a new doctor. For the evening shift, a qualified doctor is working at E & E medical centre, but this doctor wants to remain working during the evening shift only.
- Social worker Agnes Nakiirya has picked up on the task of organizing the workshops for the community and the schools in Kisozi and surroundings.
- Hope Alive Uganda has given the girls working at the tailoring studio in Kisozi a tender: making 50 table cloths for the restaurant in Jinja.
- Job vacancies at the restaurant in Jinja will be announced over the radio. Voice of Busoga, Bamboo, Kiira and Baba will announce over the radio that there are job vacancies at the restaurant. Since it is a women's project, Hope Alive Uganda encourages women to react. The first interview for the position of cashier will take place in the last week of June. Adverts were put up in Jinja and around a 100 people applied for jobs through this. Hope Alive Uganda will be busy interviewing and selecting employees! ☺
- The restaurant in Jinja has been renovated. Furniture has been bought and put into place. Most materials and equipment needed are present at the restaurant now. The last materials will be bought in the last week of June. Hope Alive Uganda has designed and ordered 1500 copies of brochures for the restaurant which will be distributed at public places, tourist information centres etc. and will be available at the restaurant itself.

- Claudia Hees from Nisadodesign – who designed the logo for Amayinja Crafts – is busy designing the menu cards for the restaurant.
- The first Worldschool group that Hope Alive Uganda will work with in 2011-2012 has introduced itself to Hope Alive Uganda. Marie-Louise and Daan from the Anna van Rijn College in Nieuwegein in the Netherlands will do research and write their essays for their final exams on whether goats droppings can be used as an energy source. The goats project will be used for their research. Hope Alive Uganda will work with a maximum of 10 Worldschool groups after the summer holidays in the Netherlands. Hope Alive Uganda looks forward to working with them!
- Voeten in de Aarde has decided to support the Cattle & Agriculture project. Hope Alive Uganda is planning to use their donation to construct a building where the workers can stay and live. Hope Alive Uganda will need to investigate the exact costs for constructing the house.
- A number of volunteers and sponsors have received the t-shirts which were made in Uganda by Hope Alive Uganda to thank the sponsors and volunteers for their support. The reactions were nice!
- Mike Dempsey from the Netherlands provided Hope Alive Uganda with football outfits for Namaganda Super Jet. The football outfits include socks, shorts and shirts. There were shirt in orange for the whole team and a large number of shirts in blue and red.
